#### Membership Renewal

That time of year again to renew your Subsig membership.

#### Project "Outhouse Heater" is complete!

Our Cabin Director Brandon Brown is pleased to report that Subsig regains its throne as the having the best outhouses in NH! This was a monumental effort by a few volunteers!!

Electrical power to the outhouse heaters runs through a dual, dedicated 20-amp circuit from the electrical service panel. The service panel is just inside the Cabin door and the breaker is labeled. When weather gets cold, you may need to throw the breaker on. (This may require switching the breaker off, then on.)

Each heater has its own thermostat. The lowest thermostat setting maintains 45 degrees for frost prevention. One outhouse can be set to a low temperature while the other is set to a desired temperature to save energy.

Each heater operates independently of the other heater and have their own on/off switch. Please leave the on/off switches in the "ON" position.



The old propane heater has been removed. The opening between the outhouses has been covered up. One outhouse will be warmer or cooler than the other depending on where the heater thermostat is set for that outhouse.

#### Road closure

The Wild River Road (NFSR 12) to the is closed 4 mi from the Shelburne South Trailhead. Beautiful and wild region, but that is a lot of extra walking for hikers considering climbing Shelburne Moriah via the Shelburne and Kenduskeag Trail.

#### **NOMINATIONS**

#### Officers.

Currently, no one has shared interest in announcing candidacy for any officer position. The presumption is that Julie Moran may take on the Treasurer role and the other current officers may serve another term.

#### Directors.

Currently, no one has shared interest in announcing candidacy for any existing Board Position. The presumption is that most current Directors may serve another term.

The role of Trips Director has been exciting and fulfilling, but also a huge amount of volunteer work. The best time to move on is when one is confident the work made a difference, and results speak for themselves. This may be a good time for the Trips Director to pass the baton to fresh legs should someone have the desire and volunteer capacity to serve in the role.



#### PROPOSED AMENDMENT TO THE BYLAWS

The bylaws were last changed in 2010. Since then, the trend in Cabin Usage has been declining at an increasing rate. The revisions are not going as planned. Technical issues with the Bylaws and lack of volunteer capacity on the Board of Directors may be contributing factors. With a tweak of one sentence and the addition of another, the bylaws can provide the following benefits:

- Resolve technical issues.
- Make room to increase volunteer capacity without disrupting the status quo.
- Increase diversity, ideas, and improvements that will help sustain a positive trajectory into the future.
- Encourage newer members to volunteer in impactful, leadership roles. At-Large Director would have equal responsibility for the board's actions and decisions.
- 1. The bylaws lack clear provisions for adding roles and responsibilities as needs arise. The bylaws state that a majority of members present and voting at any annual meeting may change the duties or designations of, or eliminate the positions of any of the Directors. However, the changes would require revising the bylaws with a 2/3rd supermajority approval. Technically, the current bylaws effectively lock Subsig into seven specific director roles without amending the bylaws.

The proposed amendment has provisions to increase volunteer capacity to fill gaps and/or continue activities in a more reliable and consistent manner. Members provided the following examples:

- Communicating SubSig News and announcements on a regular basis.
- Acknowledging and honoring volunteers past and present.
- Recording and preserving the Sub Sig history.
- Serving as proxy when a director is not available or in some manner unable to perform their duties for an extended period.
- Assisting another Director.

The proposed amendment has provisions to allow volunteers to seek a role that is better aligned with their skills, interests, and/or work-life commitments.

Subsig is a small club with limited resources. Increasing opportunities to volunteer on the Board can increase the capacity to fill gaps and unmet needs with more consistency and distribute workloads more effectively.



# 2. The bylaws lack clear provisions for adding directors to fill unforeseen vacancies. The bylaws require a minimum of seven directors but limit the number of directors to seven. A vacancy requires adding another member to the Board.

The proposed amendment provides additional Board member(s) who can fill an unforeseen vacancy without dropping below the number of required number of Directors.

## 3. The bylaws lack clear provisions to fill a temporary vacancy or add volunteer capacity to a director role.

The proposed amendment provides an At Large Director an equal role on the Board of Directors. The At-Large Director is a volunteer(s) who that take responsibility and willingly perform tasks aligned with the purpose and current needs of SubSig.

The proposed amendment has provisions for an At-Large Director to train for other roles. The volunteer can be ready to assume the responsibilities of another role and act as a proxy should the role become temporarily vacant.

Some roles may require additional volunteer capacity. Directors may benefit with more than one person completing a variety of activities and communicating with members. An At-Large Board member may be able to help another director complete a variety of activities and communicate regularly with members.

#### 4. Subsig lacks necessary organizational policies.

Certain policies may be necessary to comply with insurance requirements.

Certain policies may be necessary for obligations implicit in any director role.

- Legal obligations for Duty of Care
- Fiduciary responsibility
- Volunteer liability protection.

Certain policies may be necessary for the best interests of Subsig.

- Foster a safe and welcoming environment.
- Protect the rights of volunteers. Ensure fairness and equality for everyone.
- Mitigate avoidable risks.
- Improve hard metrics for how well Subsig is achieving its purpose.

The proposed amendment expects At Large Board members prepare necessary organizational polies as it pertains to their role and responsibilities.



The <u>complete bylaws</u> are available on www.sugsig.org. Changes to the bylaws are highlighted in red below. The proposed amendment tweak ones sentence and adds another.

#### **IV Officers and Directors**

A. The Officers of the Corporation shall consist of the **President, Treasurer, Secretary** and **Auditor.** The Officers and the Trips Director, Membership Director, Cabin Director, Trails Director, Webmaster, and Database Manager, and three (3) At-large Board Members shall may constitute the Board of Directors. With the approval of a majority of members present and voting at any annual meeting the Directors may change the duties or designations of, or eliminate the positions of any of the Directors, except those of the four Officers, but in no case shall the number of members of the Board of Directors be less than seven. These Officers and members of the Board of Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting from and by the membership in good standing and shall hold office until their successors have been elected. An Officer may hold only one office at a time. The President and Treasurer shall not be eligible for more than four consecutive terms.

11. At-large board members shall perform duties as necessary for the current needs of the Corporation, prepare necessary organizational policies, communicate with members, train for other roles, have equal responsibility for the board's actions and decisions, attend all board meetings, and engage in board meetings actively.
